HELP US TO HELP THOSE BATTLING FUEL POVERTY THIS WINTER

Due to the cost-of-living crisis and escalating energy prices, there are thousands of people living in fuel poverty across the Wakefield District. People who spend every hour in bedjustto keep warm, and working families forced to choose between feeding their children a healthy meal and heating their homes, because their wages simply don't go far enough.

The Community Foundation Wakefield District's 'Give the Gift of Warmth' campaign raises funds to provide Emergency Winter Fuel Grants for these people.

Wakefield and the Five Towns is a hard-working district but there are several areas that are high in deprivation. This year, we have seen the price of practically everything soar whilst wages have remained stagnant; this has led to more and more demand on such as food banks and community hubs, which are all working hard to alleviate poverty. People's support systems are already stretched, which will leave individuals, families, and the elderly in extremely vulnerable situations this winter.

Together with our partners, Wakefield District Housing (WDH), The Reed Foundation and Wakefield Council, we will provide Emergency Winter Fuel Grants to people in need of support. The grants will be distributed through the Wakefield Council's Welfare Department to help ensure that those struggling to meet their fuel bills can afford to keep warm this winter.

Campaign Aims

Our target this year is a minimum of £25,000, which will help to provide Emergency Winter Fuel Grants (averaging £25 each) to over 1,000 households throughout Wakefield and the surrounding areas. The grants will help prevent families and individuals from spiralling into debt during winter and may open the to other support services that could help them in the longer term.

Last year, as a result of our Fuel Poverty campaign, we provided more than 70% of the grants allocated by Wakefield Council's Welfare Department. This year, the issue has become even more desperate, and many more people need our help.



This is where you come in...how can you help

The business community in Wakefield could make a huge difference to the lives of local people in need of support. We are once again running Challenge 25 to raise as much money as we can for this very worthwhile cause.

We're looking for at least 25 teams to raise as many multiples of £25 as they can, over 25 days (or less). Challenge 25 is a great way to encourage team building and to help your staff feel proud that they're doing their bit for their friends, neighbours and peers. It's also an opportunity for you and your team to have some fun whilst doing good. Let your imagination run wild!

You could arrange a sponsored bike ride amongst staff members, a darts tournament, or re-enact your own version of the British Bake Off or Come Dine with Me. Install a swear-box in your office, hold a raffle for a day off for one lucky employee, arrange a quiz night – or come up with your own fundraising idea.

We have run our Fuel Poverty campaign for many years, and never has the issue been as pertinent nor affected so many. As the saying goes, 'there's always someone worse off than you', and it's these people we're striving to help.

The Energy Price Crisis Emergency Grants Programme is a £1 million fund which will help businesses across a wide range of sectors this winter. It will focus on providing practical support such as help to buy a more efficient boiler or install new low-energy lighting.

The scheme will be delivered by West Yorkshire Combined Authority's Business Support Team.

Help to Grow: Management Programme

Leeds Beckett University's next Help to Grow: Management Programme is starting on 24 November 2022. We are offering a great opportunity for We are Wakefield members interested in participating in the Growth Management Programme to get in touch and see whether they may be eligible for a bursary to allow their fees to be paid to attend the course.

Help to Grow: Management is a 14-week programme, delivered by a consortium of business schools across the UK. The course has been accredited by the Small Business Charter (SBC), and is financed by the Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy (BEIS). With 90% of the programme costs funded, businesses pay a symbolic fee of £750 to secure a place on this sought-after three month course.

The ambitious targets set by the Chartered Association of Business Schools (CABS) and BEIS seek to support 300,000 SMEs nationally over the programme's lifespan. The course dates and topics for the next cohort are here: Leeds Beckett YH Cohort 8 - Small Business Charter

More than 130 people packed the room at the inaugural Wakefield Business Awards by We Are Wakefield on 10 November, sponsored by Wakefield First.

The awards had been put together by WAW MD Claire Sutherley & Awards Writers Founder Louise Turner, to celebrate thriving SMEs from across the district, and the night itself, hosted at the sparkling CAPA College, didn't disappoint.

Festive Drumsticks Decorate your own drumsticks in festive style... then drum along

Equipment you will need:

Wooden spoon(s)

- - PaintPaint brushes/pots
 - Collage materials
 - Glue
 - Glitter

What to do:

-



- Choose the colours you want your drumstick to be. Explore the brush. Is it rough or smooth, does it tickle? Does it feel nice on your hands?
- Use the paint brush or your hands to paint your drumstick (wooden spoon)
- Explore the collage material: is it shiny, is it soft, is it scrunchie?
- Stick your chosen collage materials to your drumstick
- Enjoy your festive drumstick. Once it's dry let's get drumming! What can you tap to make a noise?

As Thomas' Support Worker, it was lovely to see how much he loved the drumming activity at Sense's Christmas Family Day. It might be difficult to understand why drumming would be a good activity for Thomas, who has no useful hearing (he was born without a fully developed auditory nerve, so even a hearing aid wouldn't help). But we were able to get Thomas into a position that meant he could feel the vibrations when he banged on the drum. It's loads of fun - but it's also important to Thomas' development.







Last year's in-person Christmas Family Days were much smaller than normal, as many families chose not to attend large in-person events due to the risk of coronavirus on their vulnerable children - which is why our virtual Christmas Party was so important to reach all the families.

This year we'll be continuing the virtual event, but we're also excited to be welcoming many more families to our in-person event so they can feel, taste and smell all the amazing Christmas activities.

Thomas managed to attend in-person last year and loved all the sensory activities - meeting the goat, baking the rice crispy cakes, getting crafty (you can see his handprint Rudolph below!) and of course, opening his gift! We thought carefully about what toy would be right for him, so I'm so thrilled he still plays with it.

I really hope you'll help us put on an amazing Sense Christmas Family Day again this year we couldn't do it without you!
